As we ran towards the farmers Homestead, my Mom was shouting “There’s a dog chasing your sheep!”

A swift response ensued, no dog was found and the gathered frightened flock was uninjured. The farmer thanked us and gave me a sixpence. This formed my first formative childhood introduction to shepherding.

I continued to visit the CO-OP mixed Dairy farm and neighboring farmers over the next 15 years. I learnt my basic shepherding & livestock skills within the picturesque landscapes of the Lancashire valleys and Yorkshire moors.

Having decided that livestock farming would be my future career, I pursued the path of academia through the Lancashire College of Agriculture & Horticulture and Harper Adams University. Subsequently, I was employed by Harper University. to manage research projects within the sheep flocks, beef & pig units. This gave me an extremely good insight into present and future livestock research and indirectly led me to my future long-term career within the arable and horticultural sectors. I migrated from livestock to forage, root, combinable and innovative arable crop research within the esteemed NIAB.

I was promoted within NIAB to Centre manager, conducting research and development in Shropshire, Cheshire and other centers within England and South Wales over the past 35 years.

Shortly after joining NIAB I purchased a smallholding and started up a small commercial flock of my own. I sold direct to customers and soon built up a loyal clientele. I was heavily reliant on a local butcher/abattoir which did an excellent job. The meat

was hung to set properly and the carcass sawn into the classic cuts at a reasonable cost. However changing EU legislation in the 1990’s and expansion of the local abattoir to handle beef forced me to find suitable alternative facilities proved very difficult over the coming years.

In the early 1990’s, I met my future husband, Henry, who was introduced to the world of sheep. He was a newly qualified horticulturist/tree surgeon and worked at Harper Univ.

We married in 1998 and have two sons, Ben and Harry.

With a very limited acreage of grazing swards and overwintering fodder beet we had to decide which breed of sheep and shepherding system to follow that would not interfere with my career and our family life.

Over the decades I have worked with many sheep breeds and conducted breeding research programs. I had become disillusioned with the traditional UK meat line breeds and was not happy to venture into the texel or early emerging Beltex pure bred. I was heading towards my beloved Beulah or Charollais to cross with a suitable sire or breed pure.

Then, by chance in the early millennium whilst crop monitoring near to Shrewsbury, I saw the “Black beauties” grazing a neighboring field. I had to find out more about this non-native breed. Over the next decade, I became more familiar with their characteristics, both good and bad. To me, they became irresistible, I had found my future breeding flock, it would be Zwartbles.



I started with five Zwartbles from Beryl Cope (Crofters flock) and put them to the Suffolk tup. The cross bred ewe lambs were retained for future breeding. These ran alongside my pure bred Suffolks, Beulah and commercial crosses. I was extremely impressed with the ease of lambing and the maternal side of the ewes. The immediate problem was getting hold of suitable Zwartble tups. We joined the ZSA in 2002/3 and purchased blood lines from Miss Marrigold DeQuincy the Somerwood flock, Mrs Williams Bobet flock, Berrington, Mendip, East Middle and Pistyll flocks to build up maternal blood lines. During the early years we used Artificial insemination of semen from Wolfclyde & Greenhill flocks to get around the lack of available tups. As the Zwartbles popularity grew we were able to purchase champion blood stock and improve the paternal lines by introducing bloodlines from Westcroft, Cernyw, Barmoll and Cynefin flocks.

During 2023 we purchased two tups: East Middle Jezki, bred by the late Charles Scott, jointly owned by Colin Rae & Stuart Craig. Jezki is a prolific show winner, unbeaten as a shearling, including back-to-back male champion at the Royal Highland, reserve

champion Scottish National and male champion at the 2023 Carlisle Premier sale. His offspring are already heading the Champion line-ups.

We also purchased Stainmore King Julian, bred by Miss Brown.

Both these rams have exceptional conformation that will hopefully maintain and improve upon our existing bloodlines for the future.





Aquila Zwartbles

Flock: 00472

Founded in 2007 with the purchase of sheep from the Mittonvale and Mill Thorn flocks whose progeny are still prevalent in the flock today.

The flock was added to with the additions from Speyside, Cynefin, Joyfield, Killymallaght, Torranyard and Janetstown flocks amongst others. Originally run alongside the family's flock of 500+ ewes the Zwartbles had to earn their place on the farm, which with the help of a little luck they did. Mittonvale "good sheep" came in-lamb to a Berrington ram and produced Aquila Bad Boy Z who crossed with Mittonvale "big sheep" to produce a mid-April born ram lamb named Aquila Top Gun.

This lamb led us into our first year showing Zwartbles in 2012 as a non MV accredited Any Other Breed! The story normally goes we went along had some fun and were last, however Top Gun placed 1st Any Other Breed ram and went on to be Champion at our local (confined) show Gargunnoch. Taking our newfound confidence, we headed to Stirling show the following week along with our good friend and fellow breed

promoter Joy Koelle, AKA Cloverfield Zwartbles, where we again surpassed expectations receiving Reserve AOB with the same shearing ram. The damage by this point was irreversible and the Zwartbles were removed from the cross ewes and the first of the MV tests were completed. The flock obtained its MV status early the next year and the decision to enter Ayr show was taken, for a first attempt in a strong section of sheep we were delighted to take home Reserve Champion with a Cynefin gimmer Willow, and two second place tickets with three sheep.

Lambing 2013 was to be a significant moment in the Aquila's Flock development with a Killymallaght ewe producing a tup lamb by Top Gun and a full brother to Top Gun being born. Aquila Aftershock and Action Man were the lambs in question and their impact on the breed for the Smiddyhill and Janetstown flock



included Smiddyhill Carol - Scottish National Champion 2016, Janetstown Balvenie - Scottish National Champion 2015 who went on to sell for £1900, Smiddyhill Caesar - Male Champion RHS 2015 sold for £1400. There have been a few other instances of Aquila sheep producing for others including Hayberries Hard Copy (selling for £1800) and Halestorm by Aquila Duplicate. Joyfield Just A Babe £2000 and Jaegerbomb £1800 by Aquila Grand Slam. Janetstown Kelpie £1900 by Aquila Jumanji.

There have been several sheep exported to Ireland both north and south, over the years this has become trickier to achieve but the decision was made at Aquila a few years ago to breed from scrapie resistant rams and the flock is now fully genotyped with 90% being type group one at present.

The breeding policy at Aquila was started on a commercial basis, although we love the big flashy upstanding sheep, we try to combine those traits with some more functional ones, fleshing abilities being an important one we really want a ewe that will look after herself and produce a saleable product whether at the Premier sale or in the local auction fat ring. I'm not saying they want to be Beltex's but it's more sustainable for the flock if we can maintain viable commercial value. We also focus strongly on maternal traits, milkiness, mothering ability and a general

correctness of structure. This focus has allowed us to incorporate some of the mismarked females back into the flock as recipients for our Castleview Charollais flock, a role they carry out exceptionally well for us. The desire to produce a type of sheep, whether the ideal type or not, a point that can be debated long and hard, has left Aquila with a very consistent type of sheep which in turn has led us to being the Scottish flock competition winners on two separate occasions.

The flock attended its first Highland Show is 2013 much to Duncan's dismay but he does moan about most things. We placed 2nd ewe and 4th and 5th

shearling gimmers and were thoroughly delighted and have continued to support the show every year since with Killymallaght Coolio collecting a Male Champion and Reserve Overall in 2017. Last year, 2023 Aquila Jitterbug bettered her reserve spot from the showcase show to being tapped out Overall Breed Champion. The flock has travelled to compete at the GYS on a few occasions, being placed Male Champion and Reserve Overall with ram lamb Aquila Eutopia in 2017.

The flock try to support the Premier sale as well as selling sheep/semen privately. Some of the notable sheep sold at auction include Aquila Capetown £800, Aquila Earthquake £1000, Aquila Globe Trotter £1000, Aquila Joyful Copy £1600, Aquila LuckySonOfACopy £1800.

Zwartbles sheep have allowed us to travel Britain extensively attending shows in all corners of the UK. We have met some brilliant people with a common interest while being aware that some others think we're a bit nutty. We also like to do our bit to help the breed with Duncan being a past chairman for the Scottish branch and myself having served a term on council, thankfully the arrival of children kept me down to one term! We have also hosted an open day for the SZSA in 2017 and were delighted to be part of the Welsh branch tour in 2023 which was a tremendous effort by them.

Aquila Zwartbles 2007-2024 and a good bit beyond!

Alston Manor Zwartbles

Flock: 01280

Hi, I am Miles Northmore aged 13. I live on a small holding by the coast in south Devon, I started my journey of pedigree Zwartbles in 2014 .

We lambed the ewes both having singles Alston manor cosie who we still have today and a whether called Rocky, who I showed in the ram lamb class at our local agricultural show after persuading my mum to let me show him, the judge was astonished and even got on his knees to check the authenticity of his gender!! Obviously I came last but I was only 3-years old. This was my first introduction to showing with adults in the Zwartble classes. From this day I was hooked on showing and Rocky didn't make the next show but made the plate.

With the guidance and patience of Martin Pearce and Judith Laphorne in the early days I showed our home bred Zwartbles at Devon County Show, Royal Cornwall and many other agricultural shows.

Judith helped me to learn the art of trimming of which I do all my own now and Martin with the ring craft and showmanship.

In the early days I was shy and struggled to talk to the judges even sometimes to look at them but as time went on with the encouragement of other Zwartble breeders I became more at ease.

My first big win was at the Royal Cornwall Show young handlers in 2017. Showing my home-bred ram lamb I won the junior young handler and then after swapping sheep in the final I took Reserve champion, this fuelled my passion of showing and with Jethro Kimber giving me some tips and watching him prepare his sheep for the ring I started to up my game.





Jason Kestell also took me under his wing and has helped me with show prep and confidence.

This confidence has given me the opportunity to show in the adult breed classes at county shows and hold my own.

2023 has by far been my most outstanding year. It started with lots of wins at Devon county Show in the breed classes and went reserve champion with my aged ram. Then the pinnacle was winning a huge young handler class that took 1 1/2 hours to judge.

I then went reserve champion for the young handler overall and this qualified me for the RBST young handler of the year show at Stafford Winter Fair, in November 2023.

My success continued over the summer with my homebred aged ewe taking home one champion and two reserve champions with many other 1st places.

I attended the young shepherd of the year finals and although showing a different breed because the show was for native breeds only. I learnt all about Rylands



and their quirks that morning as I was not told what breed I would be showing until I arrived at the show. I prepared my sheep, entered the ring and kept my eye on the judge and the sheep the whole time.

I was shocked to be pulled to the front in the top 10, and then to be placed 6th in the country was phenomenal, the whole experience from start to finish has only given me more motivation for 2024.

ASSOCIATION RULES 2024

ZWARTBLES SHEEP ASSOCIATION

1) Membership

- a) Full Membership: open to keepers of registered Zwartbles Sheep; allows receipt of correspondence and one vote per Membership.
- b) Associate Membership: open to non-keepers of registered Zwartbles Sheep; allows receipt of correspondence and no entitlement to voting.
- c) Honorary Life Members – Honorary Life Membership may be conferred as a gift of council for outstanding services to the Association.
- d) Subscriptions are due annually on 1st January.
- e) Standing Order forms are obtainable from the Secretary.
- f) Junior membership is until the age of 18 when the membership will change to a full member.

2) Flock Name/Ram Name

- a) Members must register a Flock Name which will appear on the Pedigree Certificate of all lambs registered as being bred by that Member.
- b) Registration of a Flock Name is conditional upon:
 - i) Payment of the Flock Name Registration Fee
 - ii) The name not being already registered by another ZSA Member and acceptable by Council.
- c) i) Naming of Males is Compulsory

- ii) Rams can only be given a name if there is a Flock Name registered with the Association
- iii) Pedigree Certificates will not be changed retrospectively i.e. the Ram name will only appear on Pedigree Certificates printed after the date of naming.
- iv) Any name, which cannot consist of more than 30 characters including the Flock name, must start with the Year Letter.
- v) Ram names cannot be used more than once within a Flock.
- vi) Ram names will not be issued by the Association if thought to be inappropriate by Council.

3) Conditions of Entry into the Flock Book

- a) Only sheep from fully registered Zwartbles parents are eligible for registration.
- b) All applications for registration must include two generations of registered parents, Date of Birth and Mode (i.e. single/twin/triplet - 1/2/3/)
- c) Imported sheep must be registered with the ZSA for their progeny to be eligible for registration.
- d) A 'Ram Service Certificate' should be forwarded with the registration application where AI or 'other ownership' ram has been used. This can be obtained from the Secretary.

4) Members' Flock Number & Sheep Identification

- a) Upon acceptance into the Association every Member must contact their regional government office for the issue of a national flock number.
- b) Flocks will also be issued with a ZSA number, e.g. 01,02,03, etc. by the Association.
- c)
 - i) The Association requires registered sheep, born after 1st January 2005 to be tagged with a Year Letter, Individual unique Number and Association Flock Number.
 - ii) The Association will not recognise animals born after 1st January 2005 not so identified.

All sheep must be tagged before an application is made for registration.

iii) Members should check with DEFRA, or their equivalent Government organisation, that they also comply with current Government tagging regulations.

iv) The annual year letter is:

Lambs born in 2021 (1st January to 31st December) = J

Lambs born in 2022 (1st January to 31st December) = K

Lambs born in 2023 (1st January to 31st December) = L

Lambs born in 2024 (1st January to 31st December) = M

Lambs born in 2025 (1st January to 31st December) = N

- d) Tags may be purchased from Members' choice of supplier.
- e) All sheep to be tagged in accordance with Government legislation.
- f) In the event of any sheep losing its tag it must be re-tagged with the original number or if replaced with a red replacement tag the association MUST be informed that the sheep has been

re-tagged and given the new tag number.

5) Registration in Flock Book

- a) Only fully paid-up members will be allowed to register sheep; this should be the breeder or importer. Lambs must be born on or after 1st January (as of January 2019).
- b) All pure-bred lambs born in the season must be registered with the Association by 5 months of age. After this date late registration fees apply.
- c) Sheep must be registered before the end of their shearling year, registration after this is not permissible.
- d) Upon purchase, all new owners should transfer the sheep into their ownership, with the appropriate fee.
- e) Sheep purchased at Official Sales will be transferred automatically.
- f) All members must complete an annual flock return each year showing how many animals they own, failure to do so will result in lambs not being registered until it is completed.

6) Lambs not Suitable for Registration

Lambs should not be submitted for registration under the following circumstances:-

- a) Abnormalities including but not restricted to:
 - i) Over/Under shot jaws
 - ii) Twisted feet
 - iii) Twisted tails
 - iv) Blindness, blue, china or wall eyes, either total or partial
 - v) Arrow tipped tail (this has appeared in the Dutch flock and is described as a tail whose end vertebrae appear to have been squashed flat, as if ironed flat)
 - vii) Sexual defects - i.e. rams without two sufficiently developed testicles apparent in the scrotum

- b) Docked Tail
- c) All ram lambs must conform to the breed standard, females can be registered if they do not meet the breed standard.

7) Shearing

- a) All sheep to be shorn after 1st January annually.
- b) All sheep being shown must be shorn bare after the 1st January and before 1st May in the year of showing.

8) Official ZSA Breed Sales and Shows

a) PRE-SALE ARRANGEMENTS

All rams must conform to the breed standard

- 1) Minimum Entry – If less than 60 animals are entered for a sale then the sale will be cancelled, this is at the discretion of Council.
- 2) Substitutes are allowed at all official sales. Substitute entries must be made to the Association secretary by the time and date stated for each sale (this will generally be 12 noon 7 days before inspection takes place, in the case of a Saturday sale the Friday prior to the seventh day) The secretary will inform the auctioneers and inspector of the ear numbers of the sheep to be presented for sale - no further alterations will be accepted.
- 3) Substitutes must be in the same age category. The information may be phoned in or emailed. If vendors appear at the sale with an animal which does not correspond to the entry (original or substitute) then the animal will be rejected.

Any substitutes shall be marked with yellow lot number on their arrival at the market.

For female sales vendors MAY be allowed a greater number of substitute entries eg. where scanning results have rendered animals not suitable for sale. In all instances,

substitutes will only be accepted within the same category.

- 4) Council may set minimum reserve (upset) prices for sale entries.
- 5) All sheep forward at Breed Sales must be registered with the **ZSA SIX WEEKS PRIOR TO SALE.**
- 6) All sheep forward will be the property of Members of the ZSA. If the governing body of the sale accepts sheep from non-members, they shall be sold at the end of the ZSA's Members' run in their appropriate ring.
- 7) Excessive entries at sales: Council reserves the right to govern the number of entries at Breed Sales (by means of reduction based on the percentage of registered stock within the seller's flock). This will be adequately described in the appropriate Sale Schedule.
- 8) All entries to be made available for inspection at the sale: No sheep to be unloaded or penned without prior instruction from a ZSA representative.
- 9) All sheep which, in the opinion of the Breed Inspectors, fail to meet the breed standards for characteristics and conformation or are un healthy or injured will be excluded from the sale. No refund of entry fees will be made for sheep excluded from the Sale. Sheep which have been excluded shall be returned to their transport forthwith and not further exhibited for sale at that venue on that date within any other sale which may be taking place.
- 10) All sheep put forward for inspection must be marked with their lot number by means of tag attached around the sheep's neck. Un marked sheep will not be inspected.
- 11) **TIMES OF ENTRY & INSPECTION**
Times of entry and inspection will be issued to all vendors. These MUST be

adhered to; late arrivals may be penalised and no un-inspected sheep shall be allowed through the sale ring.

b) INSPECTION

At all official sales the Association shall appoint a panel of inspectors who are empowered to disbar any animal from the sale which does not comply with any of the matters contained in clauses i to iii listed below.

- i)** The animal's identification is as required by legislation and the Association and corresponds to the ear number as entered for sale. Animals without the correct identification will be rejected from the sale.
- ii)** The animal is not suffering from any infectious or contagious disease.
- iii)** All rams must have two adequately sized testicles of approximately the same size and normal consistency.
- iv)** That the animal is of a quality commensurate with the level set by the Association and is of adequate weight for the age and shows no malformation in structure.
- v)** The inspectors will consider the following points. At the Carlisle Premier Sale all sheep that fail inspection must be removed from the market and not go through the sale ring.

All other Association sales rejected female sheep will be marked clearly on the rump by the inspectors and sold in catalogue order, any member refusing to have their sheep marked must remove them forth with from the market.

Rejected Rams must be removed from the market and not go through the sale ring.

- 1)** The teeth of the animal are in the correct/normal position.
- 2)** There is no abnormal deviation

in the structure of feet and/or legs.

3) Ewes shall be sound in udder

- vi)** The inspectors' decision shall be final and binding to all concerned and neither the inspectors', the Association nor the Auctioneers shall be liable to the owner of such animals or any other person or company for damage or for any loss arising out of such rejection.

Inspection is a condition of entry of the Association and compliance with this inspection shall in no way form a guarantee to the purchaser of the animals so inspected.

- vii)** Breeders are also reminded that although the Association welcomes the presentation of untrimmed sheep at Association events, they will be subject to the same inspection as trimmed sheep and should be presented clean and tidy.

c) DISPLAY OF ROSETTES/ PERFORMANCE DATA

Only cards or rosettes won at the sale at which the animal is present may be displayed, along with standardised authentic Signet information.

d) SPECIAL RULES FOR IN LAMB EWE SALES HELD UNDER THE AUSPICES OF THE ASSOCIATION

- i)** Scanning Results:- Where available ewes declared as scanned in lamb, either in the catalogue or at the time of sale, are guaranteed in lamb by the vendor as being in lamb at the date of the sale, and for a period of 7 days following.
- ii)** Vendors may elect to sell sheep as 'running with ram' where no guarantee is implied.
- iii)** Ewe lambs are sold as empty.

e) REFUNDS

A full refund of entry fees will only be issued in the following circumstances:

- i)** Cancellation of the sale, with no

alternative date offered

- ii) The flock is barred from selling due to disease restrictions imposed by government
- iii) The flock has a veterinary certificate confirming the animals are unfit for sale due to infectious or contagious disease.

f) SALE DEFINITIONS

- i) Dispersal Sale:- The term 'Dispersal Sale' shall apply where all the registered stock are sold and the registered prefix and reference number are given up by the breeder. Any subsequent registrations shall be under a new flock prefix and reference. A dispersal sale held within an official Association Sale will be held at the end of the General Sale.
- ii) Dispersal Sale sheep will not be inspected
- iii) Retention of Semen & Embryos. For all rams sold at official sales, ownership of all semen rights shall be deemed to pass to the new owner. The vendor of a ram may elect to retain semen for their own use, or sale to a third party if this is stated in the sale catalogue and re-iterated by the auctioneer at the time of sale.
- iv) For ewes from which embryos have been collected and are to be retained this must be declared by the vendor. The number of embryos which are retained by the vendor must be declared in the catalogue.
- v) At a dispersal sale the vendor may elect to retain semen and/or embryos, but a full declaration of the number of doses and number of embryos must be written in the catalogue. The vendor must further confirm if semen and/or embryos will be retained for third party use or own use only.

vi) The term 'Reduction' sale shall apply when the major number of the sheep in the flock are sold.

vii) The term 'Production' sale shall apply when a proportion of the breeding stock from the flock and the product of the flock is sold.

g) SHOWS AT SALES

- i) Show Classes will be held at most official ZSA Sales. The classes for each sale and the name of the judge will be circulated to vendors prior to the sale.
- ii) Only 4 animals per flock per class may be brought into the show ring.
- iii) Pen classes may take place at certain sales and details of this will be given in the catalogue.
- iv) At the Championship line-ups the sheep which were placed second to the Champions in their classes may be brought forward when judging of the Reserve Champion takes place.
- v) Should the Champion in any class not meet its reserve and therefore not be sold it will not be permitted to enter the show classes at other Official Breed Sales in the same calendar year if shown by the same vendor.
- vi) Trimming is freestyle but the use of artificial colouring, paint, sprays, chalk, or any other substance of any sort to aid colouring (other than cleaning) are not permitted under any circumstances and any attempt to conceal, obscure or lessen white other than by trimming is totally barred.
- vii) All sheep to be shorn after 1st January annually.
All sheep being shown must be shorn bare after the 1st January and before 1st May in the year of showing.
- viii) Any members attempting to produce

a more permanent change to the appearance of a sheep may be barred from Membership of the Association.

- ix) Any interference with natural tooth growth is not permitted on any animal of any age.

h) CONDITIONS OF SALE

Showing sheep not for sale is not permitted

Ram and Ram Lamb Fertility:

- i) All rams, including ram lambs, are warranted by the seller to be capable of natural and effective service within 70 days of the Sale. If at the expiration of the warranty period (the male fertility guarantee period) a ram is proven incapable of natural and effective service and within 14 days of the expiration of the warranty period a Veterinary Certificate is lodged with the Official Auctioneers confirming: *The ram is incapable of performing a natural effective service; and*
- ii) The Veterinary Surgeon has inspected the Purchaser's ewes and found them to be in normal, reasonable breeding condition; then the purchaser may return the animal to the Seller and be fully reimbursed.
- iii) The animal shall be deemed incapable of natural and effective service if it fails to make one ewe pregnant during the male guarantee period under natural breeding conditions and is so certified as being incapable by veterinary surgeons certificate aforementioned.
- iv) The buyer shall throughout the male guarantee period give the animal full and sufficient opportunity to prove that he is capable of natural and effective service.
- v) Ewes which have been 'sponged' and or treated with any other hormone treatment to induce or synchronise ovulation shall not for the purpose of

this guarantee be 'in normal condition'.

In-Lamb Ewe Sales:

- i) All rams specified as being the 'sire of' or 'having run with the ewe must be registered with the ZSA in order for the progeny to be registered. Ewes running with unregistered rams shall be excluded from the sale.
- ii) The vendor shall specify in the catalogue the identification of the ram with which the female has been running.
- iii) Ewe lambs offered for sale are warranted not to be in lamb unless otherwise stated in the catalogue or announced by the auctioneer at time of sale.
- iv) If within 14 weeks after the day of the sale a female sheep warranted not in lamb as aforesaid proves to be in lamb and within 16 weeks after the day of the sale the purchaser gives the auctioneer written notice supported by a veterinary certificate signed by a veterinary surgeon such female sheep has been proved to have been in lamb then if the sheep lambs naturally at a date which proves it to have been in lamb at the time of the sale, either the purchaser may return the sheep and her lamb(s) if any to the vendor or at the sole option of the purchaser the vendor shall pay to the purchaser as and for ascertained and agreed liquidation damages to cover all expenses, depreciation in value and other damages whatsoever a sum equal to 25% of the purchase price of the sheep.
- v) If any female sheep which was described in the catalogue or at the time of sale as being 'scanned in lamb' or in lamb proves not to be in lamb at the time of the sale or within 21 days after the sale the purchaser gives written notice to the

auctioneers his intention to return the animal supported by a veterinary surgeon's certificate that such sheep has proved not to have been in lamb then the purchaser may return such sheep to the vendor.

- vi) Except where stated in the catalogue at the time of sale every ewe described as with lamb at foot is warranted to be suckling all the lambs with which it is sold. If notice in writing is given to the auctioneer within 5 days after the date of sale that there has been a breach of warranty then the purchaser may return the ewe or ewes and lambs to the vendor.
- vii) All females offered for sale are warranted correct in the mouth with regards to number of teeth and udder at the time of sale unless otherwise described in the catalogue.
- viii) If any such sheep is proven to be unsound in mouth or udder that is to say is lacking any of 8 broad teeth or has damaged or worn teeth or defected udder and notice of such unsoundness is given within 5 clear days after the day of sale supported by a certificate signed by a veterinary surgeon then either the purchaser may return the sheep to the vendor or at the sole discretion of the purchaser the vendor shall pay to the purchaser as and for ascertained and agreed liquid dated damages to cover all expenses depreciation in value and other damages whatsoever compensation at the rate of 66% of the purchase price.
- ix) i) Incapacity due to injury from whatever cause illness suffered or contracted after the date of sale is not covered by this guarantee.
ii) Death within the respective guarantee period voids any liability under this guarantee.

- iii) In cases where the vendor insures his liability under the fertility guarantee the insurers shall assume the rights and remedies of the vendor under the guarantee subject to the terms of the insurance policy.

9 IMPORTED SHEEP

- a) Any sheep which has been imported must be notified to the Secretary within three months. The original pedigree certificate accompanied by the relevant payment for registration with the ZSA (see Fees) should be sent to the Secretary as soon as possible. Offspring will not be able to be registered unless the parents are registered with the ZSA.
- b) A photocopy of the ram registration certificate must accompany requests for registration of progeny from imported in-lamb ewes.
- c) Imported sheep shall carry the prefix IM on their pedigree certificates.
- d) Parents of imported sheep which remain in their country of origin shall carry letters appropriate to that country on the UK pedigree certificate of their progeny, e.g. Holland -NL, Belgium -BM for registrations from 2000 onwards as retrospective change is very difficult to administer.

10 SCALE OF CHARGES

At a Council meeting held during the last quarter of each calendar year the Scale of Charges to be used by the Association for the following year will be determined. This Scale of Charges will appear in the appropriate section of the Yearbook following their Annual Review.







BREED STANDARDS

2024


A breed standard in animal breeds is a set of guidelines which is used to ensure that the animals produced by a breeder conform to the specifics of the breed. It is the template to which the breed aspires. Not all sheep are born with the correct features or markings and absence of these does not prevent the breeder from registering the animal, but nevertheless, that registered sheep may still be deemed not to meet the breed standard.

The Zwartbles has good conformation, with a big frame, medium bone, good length and a wide pelvis. A tall sheep, with a striking and naturally polled head, a long neck and an erect posture. It is an upright and fully built sheep with an alert and lively character. Rams have a more muscular formed front part and a wider head.


Colour/Markings

- a) Fleeces should be thick and springy with a good crimp, with a true black base colour (though naturally bleached brown tips and age-related grey may occur). The fleece does not grow onto the head which, like the legs, is covered with hair.
- b) Blazes should be uninterrupted and reasonably straight and may be any width and may continue under the chin, but not into the wool. The white blaze should run from the crown of the head and may include the muzzle. Pink or black noses are acceptable.
- c) Tails should be straight and have a readily discernible white tip which should not extend more than $\frac{1}{2}$ the way up its length in both ewes and rams. (see diagram)
- d) Two to four white socks – if only two they must both be on the hind legs. The sock should encircle the leg and touch the hoof at one or more places. Socks / stockings should not be above the knee or hock (See diagram) please note it is preferred that the white does not extend this far.
- e) There should be no white in the fleece, on the ears or belly.

Limit of allowable white on limbs



Method of measuring tail length



MEASUREMENT OF THE TAIL LENGTH is taken from underneath. If for example the tail measures 30cm then the white should not extend more than 15cm AT ANY POINT on the tail.

General Description of body shape and conformation

- Head:** The head must be long and narrow with a straight to very slightly roman nose.
- Ears:** These must be proportionately large and should be placed horizontally to erectly. Drooping ears are undesirable
- Neck/Throat** Necks must be proportionately fairly long and flexible, and the latter should be carried erectly. A ram's neck must be more muscular and somewhat wider.
- Shoulders:** These should be strong and slightly sloping.
- Breast:** This should be well-developed and moderately, but not excessively, wide. Viewed from the side the breast should protrude between the front legs. An adult Zwartbles ewe should have stomach and udder at the lowest points.
- Back:** With the erect head and neck the back should run straight with easily detectable vertebrae.
- Ribs:** From the back the ribs should be round and long.
- Rump:** This should be long, slightly rounded, strong with a wide pelvis. It ensures easy lambing and room for wide udder placement. The top of the rump can be a few cm higher than the withers and the 'sitting part' of the rump can be a few cms lower than the hips.
- Thighs:** These should be muscular, long and well rounded.
- Legs:** These should be long with medium to fine bone and correct pasterns. Pasterns that are too upright or collapsed are incorrect. (*See diagram*). Correct Zwartbles posture includes straight and equidistantly placed legs the front legs of good tall ewes tend to come in very slightly from the shoulder to the knee and then straight from the knee to the hoof, but should not be rotated outwards.
- Hooves:** These may be black, striped or white.
- Tail:** The tail should be well set on and undocked.
- Gait:** The gait should be brisk, straight and springy.
- Genitalia:** The scrotum of a ram should be finely haired and not woolly. The testes should be well-developed, firm and of a similar size.
- Height:** The ideal adult height at the withers for ewes is from 75cm and rams from 85cm.




Registration into the Flock book:

Sheep with conformation defects, including but not restricted to the following, should be excluded from registration:

- a) Over/Under shot jaws
- b) Twisted feet
- c) Twisted tails - this is a corkscrew twist of any degree, not a naturally broken tail
- d) Blindness, blue, china or wall eyes, either total or partial.
- e) Arrow tipped tail - this has appeared in the Dutch flock and is described as a tail whose end vertebrae appear to have been squashed flat, as if ironed flat, like an arrow head at the end of the shaft.
- f) Sexual defects - i.e. rams without two sufficiently developed testicles apparent in the scrotum.

Sheep which do vary significantly from the breed standard should be excluded from registration. Males must meet the breed standard to be registered however females can be registered if they do not meet the breed standard and can be bred from.









Hi, my name is Anna Bullen, I am 18 years old and run Henblas Zwartbles flock with my mum. We have always focused on conformation first and markings second. They have to do both jobs.

I first came across Zwartbles when my brother and I were bought some ewe lambs to join my parents' commercial flock as we wanted something we could easily spot in the field. After this we made a trip to Anglesey show where we watched the Zwartbles show and later had a chat with Mrs Olwen Hughes Owen of the Cynefin flock who promoted the breed so well we left the show on the lookout for some ewes to start the flock. Decision made.

In the later months of 2016 off we went to Chelford auction where there was a dispersal sale of the Shavington flock. We came home with two aged ewes April and Amy. Amy being in lamb to Brimar Bailey and April in lamb to Wolfclyde Attitude. Not knowing how many lambs they were carrying. In February 2017, five lambs were born and all were perfectly marked with four ewe lambs and a ram lamb which all were kept, Amy reared her three the whole way through. September came around and we decided to increase the flock and attended the sale in Welshpool where we bought a mix of ewes and ewe lambs. The show season of 2018 came around and I decided that I wanted to try showing. I selected three sheep to start the team and decided on the Royal Cheshire Show thinking it was a rather small show to start off

with. How wrong was I, it's huge and to my surprise Henblas Emily was placed 1st in her class of shearing ewes and full brother Emmett James came 2nd, and with kind words from Raymond Heigh, we decided to go MV accredited and of course continue my showing career. After a successful showing season, we decided we needed to buy a ram for my small flock of ewes, a trip to the Cernyw flock, where we found our new tup and new friends, they also urged us to take a trip to the sale in Carlisle for a look. Which has now become a must trip every August and November. We began to sell in Welshpool where we were very well-coming by the other breeders and in return made good friends with them over the years.

2021 saw us make our debut in Carlisle selling for the first time, I took Henblas Haven into the presale show for a bit of fun before the stress of sale day where she was pulled into one of the final line ups which took me by surprise, 2021 also saw us make an investment into a new ram. Wallridge Moor Hector caught my eye instantly, we later bought him for 2300gns and to say the least was very pleased with him.

2022 saw Hectors style, conformation and personality shine through in his lambs, which was mainly ewe lambs however two ram lambs caught my eye,

Henblas Kasino Royale (an Amy son) and Henblas Keltic Chance both Hector sons to carry on his legacy after losing him the previous November. We attended the Royal Welsh show for the first time with the sheep, we were not expecting any results as it was a huge learning curve, but with the help and kindness of other breeders we were awarded 5th ram lamb with Kasino Royale. It was incredibly Hot, but an experience I will never forget. So much encouragement from fellow breeders who now have become great friends.

2023 I have had many highlights some being the Royal Welsh Show where Kash took 3rd place and Henblas Lewis took 4th place in strong classes, the following week Lewis went to the sale at Carlisle where he took 5th in the pre-sale show and later made 1100gns to say we were pleased was an understatement. The following week we took his full brother Henblas Lennox to Worces-ter. Lennox was placed 3rd in good company and sold for 950gns. I was so pleased that both boys have gone to very good



homes. Back home to prepare for the Anglesey show, Henblas Lovebird out for the second time. Really finished our show season on a high by taking 1st ewe lamb and then taking Reserve Champion female Zwartbles. We also bought Aquila Lucky-SonOfACopy to add length and character to the flock as well as his style he will be used in the 2024 season. Shavington Amy is still with us and has taken her job as a nanny very seriously and is the matriarch of our flock with most being related to her in her time with us she has produced 13 lambs all perfectly marked and only two ram lambs which were also retained. 
October arrived and a road trip to visit some Scottish flocks arranged by The Welsh branch group. I had the most amazing time. What a weekend of great sheep, company and laughs.

Nejlinge Zwartbles Farm

Written by Lene Baunbæk, Nejlinge Zwartbles Farm

Nejlinge Zwartbles Farm is located in the tiny North Zealand village of Nejlinge, just an hour's drive from Copenhagen. We call ourselves a farm, but in reality, we live in one of oldest thatched farmhouses in the village, and own no land but the garden which surrounds our house.

Coming from the most rural part of Denmark, I grew up believing that I myself would become a farmer one day. Much to my surprise, I ended up finishing a degree in economics at the University of Copenhagen. Though, after six exiting years, I left the city and went back to the countryside.

I settled down as an economic-statistics consultant, and at the same time bought a farm with Hereford cattle and a herd of local bred sheep called Saane. An all-black sheep bred for landscaping. Things were good. But then I read an article about the Zwartbles, just imported to Denmark, so exquisite and beautiful. It was love at first sight. Something had to change, little did I know that something indeed was about to happen.

Two years later, we were finally regaining balance after the financial crisis in 2008. I sold the farm just in time, by pure luck after having met the one and only, my partner Signe. Together we decided to turn our back on full-time farming and settle in the village of Nejlinge focusing on a simpler kind of life. On one condition, I wanted to continue breeding sheep, only this time with the Zwartbles.

Our village is surrounded by fields of grass. We made the tenancy, and started out with a flock of just seven Zwartbles ewes and some lambs. Zwartbles was still quite unknown in Denmark, and we received a lot of attention regarding breeding stock. We sold off a few, but kept most of the gimmer lambs ourselves. Back then, the quality of the Danish Zwartbles was either



good or bad. With a total Danish breeding stock of no more than 80 breeding ewes at the time, the breed was suffering from a narrow pool of genes and the risk of inbreed. Fortunately, an import of Dutch rams and ewes was made every second year, and since we were only a handful breeders, all of us had a share of the fresh bloodlines.

Back then as well as today, our breeding is based on the very simple overall strategy: Keep the best, remove the rest. Admitted, we do have a soft spot for just good-looking Zwartbles. However, we do our best to select with a main focus on production and maintenance while keeping respect for the Zwartbles breed standard.

While Great Britain has around 22 million sheep, Denmark has just 135,000. We have four annual shows, and a few local fairs. By the way, when showing sheep in Denmark, the wool must not exceed a length of 2 cm. While you have auctions, we only sell privately. There is a great demand for lambs here, but mostly with regard to the meat. The market for breeding stock is very little. Usually, we sell off more tup lambs per year than gimmer lambs for breeding. And so, breeding Zwartbles in Denmark, we need to focus on both quality of the meat as well as quality of pedigree lambs for breeding.

Having to focus on the annual crop of lamb, fertility is a key. However, easy lambing of (just) two lambs, lots of milk and good mothering, weaning of two quality lambs, quickly reconditioning after weaning, and pregnancy within first cycle with the ram, is just as important. Therefore, the key words in our work are fertility, reproduction, growth, adaptability, low mortality, disease resistance, and mass gain of progeny.

Being a statistician, I have a tendency to gather statistics on sheep and lamb all year round. Lambs are weighed every 14 days from birth to weaning. Ewes are also weighed regularly from lambing to tugging, and measured phenotypical when mature after their second lambing. Phenotypical measuring started out for fun. However, statistical analytics showed significant correlation between phenotypical measures, fertility, weight, structure, lambing ability etc. For example, when a sheep has a long and relative wide head, it most often also has a long body, good body weight and good growth rates. And so, quite often you can actually start by looking at the head, and quickly recognise a good quality ewe or ram.

We prefer ewes that are slightly larger than medium as they tend to have better fertility and lambing ability. We like ewes to have a strong, but feminine

head, wide and long, with a strong jaw that bites correctly. Ewes should have a feminine shape and a sound structure. We do not want them to be too deep or wide in the chest. We want them to be heavier in the back than in the front. A shape, that seems to correlate directly to fertility and mothering ability. We do not want small ewes, as they are the most inefficient. And also, we try to avoid the largest ewes as they tend to be better eaters than lambers. And so, with the ewes we try to stay away from the extremes.

We prefer a ram with a good temperament, making them easier to work with. A ram should have a good, long and wide head, and a strong jaw with a correct bite. His neck should be of good length, well placed on the body. A good structure is very important. His front legs should be strong, straight, neither narrow or too wide apart. Well placed and muscled shoulders. A moderate width of brisket to ensure easy lambing. The body long, deep and wide. His rump wide and square. Good feet and good structure. He should have a masculine shape, a good balance and good movements. Easy to wish for, difficult to find.

Lambings starts in March. This year, we have 36 pregnant sheep and shearlings, which is a bit more than usual. Together with another Danish breeder, we imported 17 Zwartbles from Holland in August last year. Four tup lambs and 13 gimmer lambs from four different Dutch breeders. We were very lucky, making the export just a couple of days before the Blue Tongue disease was discovered in the first Dutch farms. None of the imported sheep have shown any sign of illness, and all of them is doing very well.

The Dutch imported Zwartbles are kept separate from our own herd for a hole year according to Danish rules on import. Four homebred shearlings have joined them, acting as marker-sheep. The coming summer, the two herds will graze separately until the Dutch flock is released from quarantine late August. Only then will we be able to unite the two flocks.

Over the years we have made friends and worked together with Zwartbles breeders in Denmark and the Netherlands. And thanks to Facebook we have made contact with several breeders in Great Britain. Some FB-friends have evolved into real friendships. In May 2016 we had a wonderful tour in Northern England and Scotland visiting four Zwartbles breeders, Wallacetown, Wallridge Moor, Whinnow and Greystone. It was exciting to see how they worked with the sheep. At the time of our visit everybody was getting ready for the shows. We decided that we had to come back for this experience. And so, in August 2017, I reunited with our friends at Wallacetown, staying with the family for several days, having a wonderful time and enjoying both the Association sale in Carlisle and Dumfries show.

Feeling the excitement at your shows made me realize that we had to start attending shows in Denmark. For too many years, we had been focusing on what was happening in the stable and the fields back home. It was high time to expand the horizon. Time to show our sheep to a greater audience, letting the shows be an inspiration in our work, meeting new people and old friends, supporting the annual fairs, and for a couple of days getting off the farm, returning with renewed energy for the year to come.

When breeding sheep and farming in general you are always looking forward. I believe, we are quite good at enjoying the moment as well. However, especially at this time of year, I always have a feeling of curiosity and excitement about the coming lambing season. I cross my fingers, and I wish you all a wonderful season as well.





Pendle Zwartbles


I come from a family farm located near Pendle Hill in Lancashire. The farm consists of 400 acres of in-bye and 600 acres of common running up to 1800 feet. We have a small herd of pedigree British Blue Cattle and a pedigree flock of Zwartbles and Blue Texels as well as 1000 commercial sheep.

As a family we love to show at the agricultural shows and from the age of four I have shown cattle but this soon changed when I took an interest in the Zwartbles at one of the shows. In 2007, we made the trip to Carlisle where we purchased our first pedigree females from the Wolfcyde flock and Cynefin flock and established the Pendle flock.

Mum and I have enjoyed great success in the show and sale ring with the Zwartbles and we love to see our stock go on and do well for other breeders. We are both very commercially minded and have always aimed to breed Zwartbles that have a good carcass but they also need a smart head to stand out in the show and sale ring. We also like Zwartbles to have black wool and to be tight-skinned so we are very particular when buying stock sires. Over the years the

stock sires include Holmlea, Blacklee, Cynefin Teifi, Joyfield Above & Beyond, Stainmore Cracker, Selside Elusive Sid, Clarewood Hot Shot, and Coverham Knock Em Out.

Any females who aren't good enough to breed pedigree lambs are kept as either recipients or put to the Blue Texel tups. We like the maternal ability of the Zwartbles ewes as they are able to produce lambs ready for market at 10 weeks old. We keep a few tup lambs every year for breeding and sell the rest as fat lambs because there is more value in selling them straight off the dams at 40kgs. Mum and I believe the Zwartbles x Blue Texel is a very good cross, the wether lambs have a great carcass, and the females are kept as recipients or sold as ewe and lamb outfits.



One of the biggest achievements in the show ring with the Zwartbles was with Pendle Black Diamond. She was shown as a shearling in 2015, winning many breed champions, and she went on to take two interbreed championships. Black Diamond bred well for us in the flock and her blood still remains in our females.

In 2015, we topped the gimmer lamb trade at the Premier sale when we sold Pendle Cheeky Girl for 1100gns to Thomas and Isla Goldie. They did a tremendous job of presenting her at the Royal Highland Show where she won the ewe class and went on to be Reserve Champion Female.

Recently, in November 2023, we took a pen of gimmer lambs to the sale in Carlisle all sired by Coverham Knock Em Out. A special gimmer lamb in the pen was Pendle Lancashire Lass, she was tapped out earlier in the day as Reserve Champion and went on to sell for 1800gns to Tom and Gillian Blamire. The pen of lambs averaged 625gns.

The Zwartbles have had a great influence on me as a young person, they got me into sheep showing and my first judging jobs were Zwartbles classes. I have also spent many hours practicing trimming Zwartbles up to present sheep to a high standard. Not only have I developed skills, but I have also become friends with some amazing people throughout the country. A big thank you to breeders who have supported me and who have purchased from the Pendle flock.

Whilst the top prices remained buoyant, to a top of 3000gns, the numbers forward were down by almost 20% from last year, although buyers were plentiful around the ring.



from Yorkshire and the North of England and we set too with the first batch.

Several months later, the throws were made, with the wool having travelled to Bradford for scouring – around eight miles from us and then around Yorkshire for spinning and weaving, but nevertheless only travelling about 60 miles in total.

We took the wraps to several shows, not only were they popular, but there was a story with them which people liked, and certainly at the Great Yorkshire Show they were extremely popular, and, as well as being great for us, it also promoted the breed, and the majority of my suppliers were showing their sheep only a couple of hundred yards away!

I have now dealt with a number of mainly Yorkshire breeders, with a few others over the rest of the North of England for three years through Martin's contacts, with the annual amount being taken now rising to almost two tonnes a year. The wraps made with the Zwartbles Wool continue to be our best seller. History of the Zwartbles Sheep Association

The history of the Zwartbles as a sheep breed starts in the late 19th and early 20th Centuries. It is thought that the Zwartbles breed is descended from a relatively large breed of sheep called the schoonebeker, which grazed the heathlands of North East Holland.

It gets its name from a place called Schoonebeek in the province of Drenthe. The schoonebeker lambs were at the time walked to the livestock market in Norg where they were sold as store lambs to farmers from Northern Friesland who used them to fertilise their pastures while fattening. This practice declined when commercial fertilizers became available and the schoonebeker lamb trade crashed resulting in the Schoonebeker becoming an extremely rare breed.

Some of the store lambs sold had badger faced markings that resemble the modern day Zwartbles sheep and if you look at pictures of the schoonebeker you can see the resemblance including the slight roman noses, long neck and erect posture. A number of Friesian farmers decided to line breed these “Zwartbles” schoonebeker sheep and with some influence from Friesland milk sheep and Texels, the modern day

Zwartbles was developed. Interestingly, in the early years the Zwartbles was sometimes referred to as the “improved schoonebeker”.

Due to changes in farming practices, numbers dwindled to an estimated 500 animals by 1978, with only about 250 of these considered to be of purebred Zwartbles quality. Numbers started to increase by the late 1970s mainly due to the interest of hobby wool spinners in black wool and in 1985 a number of Dutch breeders started a Zwartbles flock book.

The first Zwartbles were imported into the UK in 1986 and in increasing numbers into the 1990s. In October 1995 the first meeting of UK Zwartbles breeders was held at the NSA headquarters in Malvern. Twelve flocks containing about 140 sheep were represented. The Zwartbles Sheep Association (ZSA) was born with the aim “to promote the breed and maintain its purity”

In 1997 the logo was designed and A4 pedigree certificates were developed. The first major shows to hold Zwartbles classes were the Royal Welsh, Bath and West and Great Yorkshire shows. All other sheep were shown in the AOB classes. 1999 saw the instigation of the website www.zwartbles.org, the development of the breed standard and the use of Category A and Standard.

The ZSA took a stand at North Sheep 2000 and by 2001 the association had grown to 107 members. More interest, more members and more promotion led to discussion about a new computer system and the grassroots system was purchased. In 2004 there were four official sales, Exeter (36 sheep), Carlisle (160), Builth Wells (92) and Worcester (156).

2005 saw the ZSA hold its 10th anniversary at the AGM. At this time there were about 6500 sheep in the UK and 250 members. The ZSA also employed their first secretary and we welcomed new members from Southern Ireland. By 2008 the membership had increased to 360 and it was decided to end the category A and Standard categorisation. Regional branches were created to

allow members to become more involved in their own areas.

In 2011 the first National show was held at the Royal Three Counties Show. Three years later it moved to the Great Yorkshire Show and then on to the Royal Highland Show. In 2020 the National show was due to move to the Bath and West Show but was cancelled due to the Covid pandemic.

2013 saw the development of the role of President. Joan Rowlands as our first President, followed by Carol Calder in 2017, with Vincent Davies being our current president.


The year 2015 marked the 20th year of the formation of the ZSA with a new website and Facebook page and in 2020 we celebrated 25 years. The ZSA continues to grow in strength as the number of sheep continues to grow. The association holds official sales at Carlisle, Worcester, Exeter, Northern Ireland and Welshpool. Currently there are 690 members with 15263 live animals registered on the database at the end of 2022 and we have welcomed 77 new members.




MV Scheme changes are now in place

Members are reminded that changes to the MV Accreditation Scheme came into place on 1st January 2019. The changes are to help reduce the risk of MV infection arriving in flocks with new stock.

According to SAC a recent review of MV breakdowns in accredited animals has shown that one of the big risk factors for infection is the purchase and addition of accredited animals to accredited flocks.

Updated rules mean it is now mandatory to test all animals added to an accredited flock between six and twelve months after arrival.

SRUC also strongly recommends that added accredited animals are tested when they are added to the flock. These tests are designed to address the risk of adding accredited, but infected animals.

Additionally there will now be a requirement for scheme members with non MV accredited animals on the same holding to perform a cull ewe screen of 12 non MV accredited animals at the time of the flock's routine periodic blood test.

When infection is found in the non accredited flock or the cull ewe screen is not performed the accredited flock will be classified as high risk and revert to one-yearly testing.

Members with MV accredited flocks should also note new guidelines regarding the importation of animals, semen and embryos.

Imported animals accredited under a non-UK scheme must be kept isolated until authorisation is given by the PSGHS vet to add them to your MV accredited flock.

All imported animals recognised non UK MV accreditation will require testing as per rule 4.1.2 'adding MV accredited animals to an MV accredited flock'.

However imported animals that are not accredited under a recognised non UK accreditation scheme will require testing as per rule 4.1.5 'Acquiring non MV accredited animals'

Meanwhile imported semen/embryos from animals accredited under a non UK scheme must not be used/implanted in MV accredited animals until authorisation is given by the PSGHS vet.

Semen or embryos from animals that are not accredited under a recognised non UK accreditation scheme should NOT be used/ implanted in MV accredited animals.

EAR TAGS



All registered Zwartbles sheep must be ear tagged with their pedigree number as well as the UK Flock Number. From 1st January 2005 they must also have the ZSA Member's number on the tag. (See Rules)

All sheep keepers in the UK must register with their Government Department. (DEFRA, SGRPID, WAG and DARD) and they will be given a UK Flock Number, even if they do not have a registered farm or smallholding.

New EID Regulations have been brought in from 1st January 2010 and all ear tags must comply with Government rules. Two UK tags with the same identification number must be applied if it is intended that the animal will live to 12 months of age or more. These must be applied by 9 months of age, or when the animal first leaves its holding of birth – whichever occurs first.

Please make sure you comply with the relevant Government Rules.

The ZSA issues **pedigree certificates** in the following manner:- 0023-001J

- **00023** is the breeder's ZSA membership number;
- **001** is the number unique (individual) to that sheep and
- **J** is the year letter.

For official Government purposes the ear tag must contain the UK flock number and it must contain the animal's individual number. For ZSA purposes the animal should also be identified by its individual number, the Year Letter and the Member's ZSA membership number.

(From 2010 individual numbers will start from 001). However, if you are using separate tags, for the DEFRA information and the ZSA information, the ZSA tag can start at 001 each year, (this may cause unnecessary complications though in terms of record keeping as essentially you will have 2 unique numbers for each animal, i.e. your individual number assigned by Government, plus your ZSA individual animal number – however this is down to personal choice)





A record of unused tags must be kept.

Options are:-

On one side of the tag put the sheep's individual number **followed** by the ZSA Year Letter [nothing must come in front of the unique number.

On the other side of the tag put your UK flock number – UK123456 with the individual number of each sheep.

or

On one side of the tag put the ZSA flock number with the sheep's individual number followed by the letter.

On the other side of the tag put your UK flock number – UK123456 with the sheep's individual number.

There are lots of different types and styles or ear tags, the choice of which tag you use is your own personal choice.

In the event of any sheep losing its tag it must be re-tagged with the original number (including the ZSA flock number and year letter) or if replaced with a red replacement tag the association **MUST** be informed that the sheep has been re-tagged and given the new tag number.

The ZSA recommends that the ZSA number and the individual number on the sheep's EID tag



COPPER TOXICITY

Copper Toxicity

Copper is a required mineral for all farm animals but is also potentially poisonous for all. Sheep are the most prone to poisoning due to the complicated manner in which it is stored and utilised..

Copper levels in the body are influenced by breed, age, general health and amounts of other minerals in the diet either from concentrates or forage. Breeds vary in their ability to absorb dietary copper and the continental shortwool sheep are relatively susceptible to copper toxicity. Zwartbles fall into this category and we must remember that practices used for native Cheviots, Welsh or Blackface sheep may be dangerous for Zwartbles.

The poisoning may be sudden (acute) or due to a slow build up (chronic). Whichever it is, the clinical signs are usually the same and are sudden in onset.

Acute poisoning may occur following high intakes of copper, of more than 20 – 100mg per kg of body weight, in feed or by injection. Chronic poisoning occurs when the liver's capacity to store the copper is exceeded over a period of time, but the copper is still suddenly dumped into the circulation. This surfeit is usually due to long term excessive intake, such as that from incorrect mineral supplements, access to cattle or poultry food, or certain plants in the pasture.

To add to the confusion and complexity a surplus of the element molybdenum will reduce available copper, whilst a drop in dietary molybdenum will cause a rise in available copper possibly to a toxic level.

When the critical level is reached the liver, which normally stores the copper in a bound form, suddenly releases its stored copper into the blood producing a tenfold increase in blood copper. This rush is lethal to the red blood cells as well as the liver itself. The red blood cells burst; their loss produces an inability to carry oxygen around the body and their contents block the kidneys causing renal failure. Symptoms generally seen relating to this are jaundice, anaemia, panting and red-brown urine, but in Zwartbles the two former symptoms may be very difficult to evaluate and a blood copper level may be needed.

The sheep will appear increasingly weak, wandering aimlessly or head-pressing in a corner (symptoms common to liver failure). Most individuals will die following a short period of recumbency.

Treatment of copper poisoning is supportive therapy, but it is most usually ineffective. However injections of 'binding' chemicals to strip the copper from the blood and intravenous fluids to support the circulation are the basis of the treatment. Perhaps one of the most worrying aspects is that it is often several or many of your flock that have been poisoned.

Prevention of the condition is far more effective than treatment.

Avoid

Access to cattle, pig or poultry feeds

Pasture that has been fertilised with pig or poultry manure or the silage from there

Mineral supplements or blocks intended for cattle

Copper sulphate dips left after use

Over mineralising housed sheep which are often receiving far more copper than they require in the concentrate before we even start supplementing.

You CAN and SHOULD

Look at the copper level in feeds used – a normal sheep can cope with as little as 5mg / kg (5ppm) but your hay and grain may already have more than this (approx 15 mg / kg or 15ppm),

Ensure you do not give feeds or supplements intended for other species,

Test pasture levels of minerals – remember if you test your grass you should have an idea on what the hay from there will contain.

Remember that copper deficiency is possible also producing Swayback in your lambs and coat fading in adults!





SHEEP SCAB

Sheep Scab

Sheep Scab is caused by a mite – *Psoroptes ovis* which causes intense itching, wool loss, bleeding wounds, weight loss and represents a significant welfare issue. It is highly infectious with just a single female mite carrying eggs enough to start an infection.

Sheep carrying scab mites are the most common source of infection, but transport, equipment such as scanning trailers, shears, waterproofs, quad bikes can all be a source of an outbreak.

The UK has nearly eradicated scab – twice. But since sheep scab control was deregulated in 1992, cases have exploded with 10,000 cases annually reported.

Treatment options are dipping with OP dip or injection with a Macrocytic Lactone (ML) such as Doramectin (Dectomax™) or Moxidectin 2% (Cydectin 2%™). But the first recorded case of ML resistant mites was first seen in 2017 and is now widespread. This has meant a switch back to the use of OP dip and the rise in dipping wagons. It should be noted that showers should not be used. Not only are they not licenced or effective against scab as they don't reach the mites living in the ear canal, it is also not advisable to aerosolise and then inhale OP dip.

The main defence against sheep scab is biosecurity – keep scab out. All incoming sheep should be quarantined and either tested or treated. This includes newly purchased sheep from sales, privately or sheep that have been away to shows. The sheep scab blood test picks up antibodies if the sheep has been exposed to scab mites and will be positive two weeks after exposure. The risk of quarantine treating scab with an ML injection is if the sheep are carrying resistant mites it will be ineffective and potentially the whole flock will be exposed to resistant mites. For those flocks with showing teams that will be on and off the farm all showing season the best course of action is to quarantine the whole show team away from the rest of the flock for the whole showing season. Two weeks after the last show, the show team could then be blood tested and treated if necessary, before returning to the main flock.

Wormer Resistance In Sheep


Anthelmintic resistance, or wormer resistance is impacting sheep keepers whether you have five ewes or 500. When a worm is ‘resistant’ to a wormer, it means that the worm can survive a drench, leaving it alive within the sheep to pass eggs onto the pasture. Resistance to the original three classes of wormer (white, yellow, clear) is already widespread across the UK.

How to avoid developing resistance in your flock:

- **Right product** - is the product you are using going to work for the problem you are treating? Do you know what type of worm you are treating? Do you already have worms resistant to one or more classes of drench? Have you done a drench check worm egg count (WEC) to check the product used has worked?
- **Right amount** - Always check the packet for the dose rate and set this to the heaviest animals in the group. Calibrate your dosing guns, number 10 on the dial doesn't mean 10ml will be dispensed! Simply squirt a few doses into a clean syringe or small jug to ensure that the right volume is consistently delivered. Do this every time as the difference in drench viscosities can alter how much is dispensed, for all of my fellow tight Northerners, you can pour this back into the bottle so it isn't wasted!
- **Right way** - check the packet, is it injectable? Under the skin or in the muscle? If it's a drench make sure to go

over the back of the tongue so it isn't spat out. Take extra care in lambs, dosing gun injuries can be fatal!

- **Right animals** - Aim to leave 10 - 20% of the group un-treated. Across a group, not all of the lambs or ewes will be struggling with a high worm burden, these 'good doers' are visible to your eye being the fittest animals, growing well and not showing signs of scour. Leaving these animals untreated is beneficial, the untreated worms create an 'in-refugia' population. This low level burden will outcompete any resistant worms being shed by treated animals and reduce the speed of resistance developing. The same principle can be used at lambing, fit singles and twins are often managing their worm burden well and go on ok without a worm treatment however, triplets, leaner twins or any ill ewes are likely to be shedding more eggs and benefit from a treatment.
- **Right time** - do the sheep need a treatment at this time? Have you done a WEC? Sheep build their own immunity to worms over time, too frequent dosing



stops this from developing and leaves us reliant on wormers. Ideally WEC lambs monthly from six weeks of age or turnout for the early lambers. WEC are especially useful pre-tupping, the ewes may surprise you and are often managing the worms well on their own without the need for any treatments.

- **Quarantine** - ALL new animals, don't make someone else's worm resistance problems your own! All new stock should be housed for at least 48 hours and treated with Purple drench (5SI) or a combination of Orange (4AD) and Clear (3ML) drenches. This should clear out any resistant worms in your purchase and they will be ready to continue further isolation on 'dirty' pasture, allowing your own 'brand' of worms to be picked up. This out-competes anything resistant potentially left in your new sheep. It is also a good opportunity to nip in the bud any other nasties which can threaten your flock including scab, footrot, CODD, and pink eye.

As well as allowing gradual exposure to build the immunity of your flock, you must minimise any underlying issues which put the brakes on performance. Maintaining target body condition of ewes and ensuring balanced nutrition is one of the first things to consider, many feed companies will test haylage for you and aid in planning a ration for pre lambing and lactation which supplies enough energy and protein to support the ewe and her lambs. Lameness, fluke, trace elements and diseases such as MV, Johnes and OPA are just a few of the other issues to keep in check.

Altering your grazing patterns is a useful way of reducing pasture contamination and reducing worm burdens. This can be difficult depending on your grazing situation, a simple start is to ensure you have a record of which stock is where and when. That way you will know which fields are likely to have higher levels of pasture contamination and avoid putting lambs on this ground. Fit adult sheep should have a higher level of immunity and can be used on dirty pastures as 'mops', this is because they can graze pastures with high worm larvae contamination but only shed a low egg level themselves, essentially 'cleaning' the pasture of worm larvae. Forecasts based on weather conditions are available for free online to allow risk based treatments for Nematodirus in lambs. Other options to reduce pasture contamination include alternating grazing with cattle, using silage aftermaths or cover crops.

The SCOPS (Sustainable Control of Parasites in Sheep) website (www.scops.org.uk) has plenty of resources on different control strategies available and your own Vet is able to provide a tailored healthplan to aid the management of your flock. Funding is available towards this and worm resistance testing through the Animal Health and Welfare Pathway from the RPA.





SELECTING LAMBS FOR SLAUGHTER

My day job involves sourcing and selecting finished lambs and cattle to the appropriate weight and fat specification for Dunbia, while aiming to maximise financial returns for the farmers.

When determining when your lambs are ready for slaughter, your overall aim is to produce an lamb that the consumer wants. This is ultimately, a clean, dry lamb which is sold at the right time to hit the optimal specification for weight, conformation and fat class. When weighing lambs there are several factors to consider.

- Ensure your weighing equipment is calibrated.
- Try to weigh your lambs at the same time of day on each weighing day – a full stomach

can weigh twice as much as an empty one and can greatly affect the kill out percentage.

- Wet fleeces weigh more than dry ones.




Figure 1: Key handling points for lamb selection

However, liveweight and visual assessment are just a guide, and in order to be more accurate with your selection, it is important to handle each lamb at the key handling points shown in figure 1 to ensure their conformation (shape) and fat cover meet your target market.

Handling Points - Conformation

To assess conformation (shape) there are three key areas to focus on

- The thickness and flesh over the spinous process of the **shoulder (A)**
- The fullness of the **loin (B)** between the spinous and transverse processes
- The depth and thickness of the **hind leg (C)**

When you are handling, a well conformed lamb will have spinous processes on the shoulder that are less prominent to touch with flesh beginning to create a convex profile and a loin which is full and transverse processes difficult to detect. In comparison, a lamb with a poor conformation will have a concave profile over the shoulder where the spinous process is very prominent and a loin which has little body and transverse processes easy to detect. Conformation is largely influenced by breed and genetics, but in my experience pure zwartbles lambs can comfortably meet the ideal 'R' grade if not better.

Handling Points - Fat Cover

To assess fat class there are three key areas to focus on

The transverse and spinous processes of the **Loin (D)**

The bones in the **Dock (E)**

Individual **Ribs (F)**

When assessing lambs for fat cover, a lamb with a fat class of 3L will require light to medium pressure to detect the bones on the dock, transverse and spinous processes on the loin and individual ribs will have a spongy feel.

Zwartbles are well known for their ability to produce lean, sweet tasting meat. Although generally, fat class of a lamb is also largely influenced by the finishing diet and sex. Ewe lambs have a tendency to lay fat down easier, followed by castrates, with ram lambs generally handling leaner.

Remember- practice makes perfect! If you are not sure, an experienced friendly farmer should be able to help with selection. There are many other variables that can affect the level and rate of finish of lambs including grass growth, weather and time of year.



Controlled Breeding in Sheep

I have split this into simple sections : **Why ? How ?**

Why Bother ?

Lots of people will tell you that they just pick a date and turn the tup in amongst the ewes and they get great results !

The main reason for manipulating the breeding season and ultimately the lambing date is one of efficiency. By controlling the lambing time we can get the maximum number of ewes to lamb in the minimum time. This results in less labour to watch them lamb or lambing to coincide with work / school holidays etc, more efficient feeding of the ewes pre-lambing and post lambing . It gives a more compact even group of lambs that can be handled as a single group, resulting in less waste of veterinary medicines , creep feed and ultimately a group that if destined for the sale ring are more even in size resulting in better prices. Those destined for the prime lamb sales can go in a larger batch resulting in fewer trips to market.

How ?

In its simplest form , controlled breeding can be achieved through flushing of the ewes pre-tupping. This involves restricting the nutrition of the ewes for about a month and then introducing them on to a rich sward for a couple of weeks before introducing the tups. The increased nutrition encourages the ewes to cycle and also to produce a larger crop of lambs.

Teaser tups or vasectomised males can be used to further tighten the lambing period. The teasers are introduced around a fortnight prior to the tups, the presence and “attention” of the males encourages the ewes to start to cycle. When the tups are put in the bulk of the flock should be ready to mate in the first week .

Regulin implants are occasionally advocated for bringing forward the breeding season in sheep. These are melatonin devices that mimic the decreasing daylength responsible for inducing the breeding season in sheep. With the lambing date now at 1st January, there is little need for these in the Zwartbles breed.

Medical synchronisation of the ewe revolves around the use of synthetic progesterones generally in combination with PMSG.

Chronogest Sponges - The original form of synchronisation and still the most commonly used. Small sponges coated in progestagen are inserted intra-vaginally for 12 days and then removed. Generally an injection of PMSG is given at this time to increase ovulation rate and litter size (less of an issue in Zwartbles than other breeds !).

The rams are introduced 36 hours later at a rate of one ram to 5-8 ewes .

For fixed time AI , insemination is usually around 54 hours later .

CIDR Ovis - Cidrs have been available in the UK for sheep for the last three years . They have a similar mode of action to sponges, just a different design, being small Y-shaped devices coated with progesterone. Many people prefer them as they are smaller and easier to insert than sponges, particularly in gimmers which tend to be less roomy .

Prostaglandin Injections - The use of prostaglandin injections given 7-9 days apart has been used to synchronise ewes, but as the product is generally a vet only administered injection it is a protocol rather used outwith experimental farms.

Important Points

Ewes for synchronisation should have been weaned at least 3-4 weeks

Ewes should be aimed to have a body condition score of 3-3.5 at mating


Order your sponges and PMSG well in advance, in certain years there have been delays or shortages of both products

Cleanliness and gently insertion of the devices are important

Have a pre-breeding check carried out on your ram prior to inserting sponges - NO RAM = NO LAMBS

If using AI with CIDRs, check with your provider as there is a difference in the timing of insemination compared with sponges.

Approximate conception rates of 70% can be achieved.

Some Tips On Show Preparation

There is a range of differences between exhibitors in how they organise their showing year, select their potential show team and then feed and begin their show preparations.

In this brief introduction to getting ready for showing, some ideas on how to achieve a well presented show animal are given. This is certainly not the only course to take and many exhibitors will have their own special ways to get their animals prepared. Our only advice to the new exhibitor is to talk to as many other exhibitors as possible and pick their brains on how to go about show preparation. You will find exhibitors will probably give you slightly different advice on what to do, but by using this information you will eventually end up with the ideal way for yourself and gain that satisfaction of presenting your animal in front of a judge in as good show condition as possible.

One question often comes up and that is when should the showing year start? Again this depends very much on an individual. Many exhibitors will say that this will start as early as possible and begins with watching your lambs as they play to first of all make sure they are correct in their markings and then look for those that 'show themselves off'. This will give you the basis of which animals may potentially end up in your show team together with those adults that have show potential.

You now need to consider your feeding regime. Most show animals need to be presented in show condition, but not too fat. This will depend on two main things.

1. Giving the correct amount of hard feed to help improve the animals condition.
2. Knowing your own animals, enabling you to give the correct amount of hard feed – Some animals need more feed to achieve the same end result.

All zwartbles sheep being shown, must be sheared between 1 January and 1 May in the year they are to be shown, see ZSA Rule 7. Remember after shearing the fleece is very short and begins to regrow quite slowly at first. If you are planning on showing animals at shows early in the season you need to take this into account when considering when to shear. A later shorn sheep will look very bare compared to an animal shorn earlier. The other consideration is the time of year as the animals may need to be housed after shearing and possibly covered with a rug for a while in order to acclimatise to the change in temperature.

In a show environment you will need to be able to lead your sheep – to initially get to the show ring and then to move to the required position requested by the judge. Initially any sheep on the end of a halter will not lead naturally. If you try to apply any pressure on the halter the sheep responds by pulling back as it feels the pressure of the halter on its head. Once the sheep begins to move initially it will often leap into the air and can

on occasions throw itself down. Release the pressure and the animal will settle again ready to start round 2. This behaviour is only temporary until the sheep is used to the halter. Then it is possible to learn it to lead and once learned is not forgotten.

You have now reached the stage of a well behaved sheep in good condition and with a reasonable length of fleece ready for trimming. It is possible to trim your sheep on a halter tied to something secure but your sheep's natural reaction is to twist away so it is good advice to invest in a headstock which prevents this. Also a dressing/trimming stand makes the job of dressing easier as it raises the sheep up to a good working height. This incorporates a headstock so that the sheep is held safely and securely.

The first job to perform on your sheep is to wash your sheep thoroughly with a livestock shampoo making sure it is rinsed clean afterwards and then allowed to dry thoroughly, preferably outside as this makes the drying process much quicker. The main equipment needed to dress your sheep is a set of sharp offset shears, a carding comb and preferably some fleecefix to help to condition the fleece.

Now on to trimming your sheep. First of all dampen the fleece with a fine spray before starting to card the fleece. The carding comb is used to make the fleece stand up. If you let the comb go in too deep

you will find it almost impossible to pull the comb through the fleece without lifting up the sheep. The knack is to let the comb go into the fleece just enough to pull the top section up into a 'frizz'. With practice you will learn how to insert the comb to provide a consistent standing frizz all over the animal.

The hand shears should be used to trim the raised fleece by laying the flat of the blade on the fleece with a very small amount of downward pressure and operating the shears as they are moved along the animal. The shears will have the effect of flattening the base of the fleece whilst removing the carded up fleece. The result will be the removal of the brown sun bleached part of the fleece leaving the true black colour. This process may need to be repeated to remove all of the brown wool. It is better to trim little and often for good results as trimming too deep can leave 'holes' in the fleece.

One suggested order of trimming is to start on the back of the animal and get it nice and level. Then work down each side giving the animal a neat shape overall. When the trimming is completed to your satisfaction a final spray with fleecefix is useful, followed by patting the fleece down with a wooden patten. It is useful to rug your sheep after trimming as it will keep the animal clean before showing.


